

NCHU Student Self-Government Groups and Assistance Regulation

Passed by 42th University Affairs Meeting dated 2002

Approved by the Ministry of Education dated 2003

Passed by 42th University Affairs Meeting dated 2014

- Article 1 This regulation is established according to Article 41 of NCHU Organization Regulation to help students to have a better understanding to democracy, to encourage students to communicate with each other and to be more willing to serve the community.
- Article 2 Students of this university may establish their self-government groups by university, college, or department (institute) level according to this regulation. Students who found the group are the members of the group.
- Article 3 The Student Self-Government Association established according to this regulation would represent the students and help them with their life, on-campus performances and their rights.
- Article 4 Establishment, management and dismiss of the self-government group should all be handled according to the regulation and be reported to the school.
- Article 5 Self-government groups should follow the school regulation and the law. Office of Academic Affairs and related academic departments should also assist self-government groups.
- Article 6 Self-government groups should discuss their funding according to legal procedure and report to the school for approval before raising funds or taking fees from members. And all groups should not raise money from the outside. The funding of the groups should be managed and allocated by themselves with great care. Groups should also announce their usage of the funding to members on a regular basis. They will also be supervised and assisted by the units in the university. The usage and expensed of the groups should also follow the accounting procedure and related rules.
- Article 7 The borrowing of venue and equipment and the posting of posters and other publications should all follow the regulations of Student Clubs.
- Article 8 Self-government groups which posts publications on the campus bulletin board should follow the related regulations. Self-government groups and the people who post publications should take the legal responsibilities of their acts.

- Article 9 Individuals who want to hold activities should register with the self-government groups and ask the groups to apply for them.
- Article 10 According to the school regulation, self-government groups may send a student representative to attend the meetings which are regulated in the NCHU Organization Regulations.
- Article 11 According to the Guidelines for Student Clubs, self-government groups should attend the evaluation for student clubs.
- Article 12 Leaders and student representatives of self-government groups should attend the workshops, visits, exhibitions and community services to enhance their abilities in handling public affairs and managing their groups.
- Article 13 The person of the self-government group who violates the university regulations and related law and the leader of the group should take both on legal responsibility.
- Article 14 These regulations shall be implemented after being passed by the Student Affairs Meeting and University Affairs Meeting and approved by the Ministry of Education. Any amendments shall be processed accordingly.
